Hugh Robertson MP
Minister for Sport
& The Olympics

Hugh Robertson MP was born in Kent on 9 October 1962. An army officer from 1985 – 1995, he saw active service in Northern Ireland, the Gulf war and in Bosnia during the siege of Sarajevo. He then joined the investment arm of Schroders.

He was elected to Parliament in June 2001 as the MP for Faversham and Mid Kent, and was Shadow Minister for Sport and the Olympics since 2005 before taking up his new Ministerial position.

Born in Grenada, Brendon Batson will always be associated with the generation who pioneered the presence of black players in British football and helped inspire the movement to eradicate racism from the game.

After retiring from football, he became a senior football administrator and Deputy Chief Executive of the Professional Footballers Association (PFA).

In 2002 he left the PFA and joined his former club, West Bromwich Albion as Managing Director. Since 2003 he has headed Batson Sports Consultancy, with clients including the FA. He was elected Chair of Sporting Equals in 2010.
